WHAT IS A YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP?

A pre-apprenticeship is a program that teaches basic technical and job—readiness skills for a designated occupation leading to possible entry into a registered apprenticeship program. Pre-apprenticeship involves classroom instruction and work-site visits, job-shadowing, or on-the-job training.

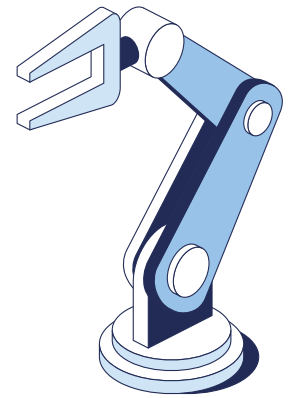


WHAT IS A REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP?

A registered apprenticeship is a formalized program that combines on-the-job training with related classroom instruction through BCCC. Apprenticeship is an “earn and learn” model. Apprentices are full-time employees who earn wages while they learn on the job.

CAREERS

- **Maintenance Technician-** Perform diverse duties like installing, troubleshooting, repairing/maintaining equipment for production
- **Electrical Lineman-** Install, repair, and maintain cables and wires using electrical power and distribution systems
- **Production Process Technician-** Operate equipment and monitor and document all process and results of the standard operating procedures in the manufacturing process.
- **Welding Technician-** Join metal materials together. Learn the different types of welding (ARC, TIG, MIG) and how to safely work in this environment
- **Injection Molding Technician-** Perform beginning and interval inspections on plastics moldings. Collect data to maintain production and quality.



GENERAL INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUTH APPRENTICES

- Must be a junior or senior in high school in good academic standing with successful completion of two career & technical education classes.
- Written recommendation from a career & technical education educator or school administrator.
- High school students can receive up to two high school course credits and a registered apprenticeship placement with full-time employment at a local company or agency.

The Youth Apprenticeship is an open enrollment model where students will be placed on a waitlist. When an employer has a placement, the student will be contacted of a training opportunity. Selected students will participate in a short boot camp at BCCC and begin on-the-job training with the company.
