GENERAL INFORMATION

Pre-Registration is Required

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Submit your registration by phone, mail, online, or walk-in at least one week before the class starts. Late registration may result in a full or canceled class due to low enrollment. Registration instructions are on p. 2 or at https://www.beaufortcc.edu/conedregistration/.

Who May Register?

Anyone 16 or older may register for a Continuing Education course. Students under 16 can take Defensive Driving courses year-round but cannot register for other continuing education courses except personal enrichment courses in summer (May 16 - Aug 14).

Fees, Books & Supplies

Registration fees do not cover textbooks, supplies, or lab fees. Fees are set by the NC General Assembly, based on course hours. Courses using technology or Blackboard will have a \$5 tech fee. The BCCC College Bookstore is open Mon-Thur. 9 am-4 pm, and Fri, 9 am-1 pm. Visit www.beaufortccc.edu/bookstore or call 252-940-6260.

Refunds

The NC Community Colleges System sets the refund policy. (1) A student withdrawing before the first class meeting gets a full refund. (2) A full refund applies if a class is canceled due to low enrollment. (3) After the class starts, a 75% refund is granted if the student withdraws before or at the 10% point of the class hours. (4) Self-supporting class registration fees are non-refundable once the class begins. More details are at https://www.beaufortccc.edu/conedregistration. Refunds take 30-45 days to process.

Transcripts

Students may request copies of their Continuing Education transcript via written or electronic request to the Continuing Education Registration and Records Office. Requests can also be faxed to (252) 940-6254. Transcripts are released to colleges, agencies, or employers with written authorization. Official transcripts cost \$2, and unofficial ones are free via the Self-Service portal. For High School Equivalency (GED or HiSET) transcripts, visit diplomasender.com or call 252-940-6209 for assistance.

Children on Campus

Children under 16 are not allowed in instructional areas unless authorized by a college administrator. The Summer Enrichment Program for Kids is an exception.

Refund Policy: A student who officially withdraws from class(es) prior to the first class meeting will be eligible for a 100 percent refund. Also, a student is eligible for a 100 percent refund if an applicable class is canceled due to insufficient enrollment.

After the respective class begins, a 75 percent refund shall be made upon the written request of the student if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10 percent point of the scheduled hours of the class. Only class fees can be refunded in this circumstance. BCCC local fees are non-refundable. Registration fees for self-supporting classes are non-refundable once the class begins. Where a student, having paid the required registration fee for a semester, passes away during that semester (prior to or on the last day of examinations of the college the student was attending), all registration fees for that semester may be refunded to the estate of the deceased.

Finish Line Grant

Complete your academic training in the face of unforeseen financial hardships. If you're facing financial emergencies through no fault of your own, funds from the Finish Line Grant can be used for: housing, medical needs, dependent care, rent, car repair, internet service, or other financial emergencies. Students enrolled in courses that fulfill 25% of an approved short-term workforce development training program and maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress might be eligible for a Finish Line Grant. To be eligible for this \$500 scholarship, apply directly with our Continuing Education Office. This scholarship will pay up front for registration fees and books and materials.



Golden LEAF Scholarship

The scholarship will provide up to \$250.00, and can be used for tuition, fees, books, supplies, transportation and childcare expenses related to attending classes during the academic year. 

Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) Program CDL Class-A, Hazmat, EVO, and Forklift (Hybrid Program)

The Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) Truck Driver Training program will train students to drive a Class - A combination vehicle and prepare students for their pre-trip inspection, of road skills test and the road-driving test, which are all components of the NCDMV Commercial Driver License (CDL) exam. This course focuses on students working toward obtaining a Class-B CDL or upgrading from a Class-B to Class-A CDL who are employed in industry and need to complete ELDT for the NCDMV Commercial Driver License (CDL) exam. Funding assistance may be available. Scholarship eligible.

This program is an online hybrid program, which involves weekly required online assignments apart from weekly on-campus driving in a scheduled range and over-the-road lab. This program is made possible through partnerships with Golden Leaf Foundation, NCDOT, Weyerhaeuser, Alligood's Garage, and locally owned insurance groups. Books are available in the BCCC bookstore (book prices are subject to change by the publisher).

Registration prerequisites: a Valid Class-C driver's License, Valid NCDMV any State Commercial Class-B or Commercial Class-A permit, a valid DOT medical card, and a negative DOT drug screen (within 30 days). Students must provide proof of enrollment in a random drug testing program with their employer per 49 CFR Part 40. Prior experience operating a Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) is required.

The first 8 weeks (about 2 months) of this class will be online and not require campus attendance.

UAS OPERATIONS (DRONES)

Beyond 107 - Level 1 & Level 2: Advanced UAS Operations

Credential: Trusted Operator Level 1 & Trusted Operator Level 2, Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International

This course is designed for FAA Part 107 Certified Pilots and revisits and expands on several concepts introduced on the exam. Topics covered include routine operations in accordance with Part 107 that do not require a waiver, flights using aircraft less than 5.5 pounds, regulatory knowledge and compliance, general mission planning protocols, maintenance and inspection programs, and introductions to safety management systems. Additional topics include operations that require FAA waivers and approvals, UAS operations under FAA Part 119.1 (including crop dusting), and those with elevated risk factors such as flying at night, and those necessitating visual observers or an Air Boss. A focus on Crew Resource Management (CRM) includes developing procedures related to standard operations (SOPs), emergency procedures, maintenance, flight records, pilot proficiency, and reporting. Upon successful completion of coursework, students will sit for end-of-course knowledge exams and a flight assessment and, if successful, become certified as Level 1 & Level 2 Trusted Operators through AUVSI. Students who elect the certification option will pay an additional estimated \$100 charge to AUVSI at the time of testing. Register & pay online.

Beyond 107 – Level 3: Hazardous UAS Operations

Expanding on Beyond 107 – Level 3, this course focuses on operations in safety-critical and complex areas that require higher levels of risk mitigation. Examples include industrial and chemical facilities, and infrastructure such as wind turbines, powerlines, communication towers, rail, and pipelines. Operations include those from moving vehicles, in confined areas, close to severe weather, and in remote, harsh, hostile, or testing environments. Upon successful completion of coursework, students will sit for an end-of-course knowledge exam and flight assessment. If successful, students will become certified as Level 3 Trusted Operators though AUVSI. Credential: The Recreational Unmanned Safety Test (TRUST), Federal Aviation Administration

This course is designed to introduce students to the scientific principles associated with the building and testing phases of small unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV). Upon completion of this course, students will be familiarized with the parts and components that make up UAVs well as have the ability to troubleshoot repairs. Career and College Promise (CCP) offers North Carolina students a jump-start in college or in a career while still in high school. This dual-enrollment program allows eligible high school students to enroll in college classes at BCCC. Students who successfully complete college courses can earn transferable credits that count toward a degree, and best of all, those courses are free! In many cases, students can also earn dual credit—meeting their high school graduation requirements with college courses.

University transfer courses transfer to all NC public universities and many private colleges. Students can remain a part of their high school student body and participate in athletics, clubs, and activities with their high school classmates. CCP classes are offered on our campus, online, broadcast via the Information Highway, and, in some cases, on a high school campus.

For University Transfer Pathways, students must be a high school junior or senior, have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8, or demonstrate college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics on approved assessments or placement tests. For Technical Education Pathways, high school freshmen & sophomores must see their high school counselor or liaison for eligibility requirements. Juniors & seniors must have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8, or demonstrate college readiness on approved assessments or have the recommendation of their high school principal & meet the prerequisites of the career pathway.

MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGY



This program will provide handson, clinical application experiences to prepare students to perform clinical laboratory procedures that are instrumental in the maintenance of health. Laboratory technicians assist physicians in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases.

With small class sizes and dedicated instructors, students can earn an associate degree in as few as four semesters. Core courses include Clinical Chemistry, Hematology, Microbiology, Urinalysis, and Immunohematology (formerly known as Blood Bank).

Graduates may be eligible to take the examination given by the Board of Certification of the American Society for Clinical Pathology. Employment opportunities include laboratories in hospitals, medical offices, industry, and research facilities.

MECHANICAL ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY





Mechanical engineering is all about the study of physical machines involving force and movement. As one of the broadest engineering disciplines, it combines physics, math, and materials science to design, analyze, manufacture, and maintain mechanical systems.

Our program prepares you to design, develop, build, and test mechanical components. You'll learn to create various mechanical parts, choose the best manufacturing methods, produce the components, and test them for functionality. This Design-Build-Test approach gives you hands-on experience with modern manufacturing processes. Jump start your future in mechanical engineering today!

Graduates of the program will find employment opportunities in the manufacturing or service sectors of engineering technology.

The median salary for a mechanical engineering technician in our region is \$54,700.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY



Ready to dive into the exciting world of technology? Our program sets you up for success as a designer, tester, support technician, system administrator, developer, or programmer. You'll work with cutting-edge software and hardware to manage information systems in fields like database services, cybersecurity, and healthcare informatics.

Through hands-on coursework, you'll master the skills to tackle real-world tech challenges. Whether you're into interactive media, network systems, programming, or information security, our curriculum has you covered. Transform your tech passion into a rewarding career!



BOAT MANUFACTURE & SERVICE





Set sail towards a rewarding career in the boat manufacturing and service industry with our Boat Manufacture & Service-Boat Construction diploma! This program offers a comprehensive education in boat design, new construction, and composite fabrication. You'll gain hands-on experience and learn how to bring boat designs to life, whether you're working on specific components or providing complete services for boats and yachts. Course work includes reading marine blueprints, lofting, constructing forms and mold-making, application of concepts and techniques in composites, marine woodworking, interior finishing, cosmetic and structural repair, and an introduction to marine systems. Dive into the world of boat building and chart your course to success!

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION



This program introduces students to the various aspects of the free enterprise system. Students are provided fundamental knowledge of business functions, processes, and an understanding of business organizations in today's global economy.

Course work includes business concepts such as accounting, business law, economics, management, and marketing. Students will learn to apply these concepts through computer applications, communication, team building, and decision making.

Through these skills, students develop a sound business education base for lifelong learning.

BSBA Transfer to ECU

The ECU College of Business will grant BCCC graduates in the transfer pathway 60 hours of credit toward a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA) at the university.

Through the agreement, ECU provides graduates who complete the transfer pathway guaranteed admission and acceptance of appropriate transfer hours, up to 60 credits from the AAS in Business Administration program with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Students must have at least a "C" in eight specific classes. These credit hours will include a combination of hours of general education credit, hours of elective credit, or hours of credit toward the major.

Graduates are prepared for employment opportunities in government agencies, financial institutions, and large to small business or industry. The median salary for a business manager in our region is \$39,300.

This program is offered entirely online!





HUMAN SERVICES TECHNOLOGY

The Human Services Technology program prepares students for entry-level positions in institutions and agencies which provide social, community, and educational services. Along with core courses, students take courses to prepare for specialization in specific human service areas.

Emphasis in core courses is placed on development of relevant knowledge, skills, and attitudes in human services. Fieldwork experience provides opportunities for application of knowledge and skills learned in the classroom.

Pathways:

Transfer

Graduates of this pathway can transfer to UNC-Wilmington to complete a Bachelor of Social Work either in person or online. This pathway is geared to students who not only need to be career-ready, but plan to continue their education. More courses on this pathway transfer to private and public schools versus the non-transfer pathway. Students will take higher level courses in math, English, and transferable elective courses. Students who continue with their education often pursue undergraduate degrees in social work, criminal justice, sociology, psychology, or family and community service degrees. This pathway requires completion of 66 credit hours and a 160-hour internship.

Non-Transfer

This pathway prepares students to enter the human services field as a trained professional. Courses emphasize development of relevant knowledge, skills, and attitudes in human services. A 160-hour internship provides opportunities for application of knowledge and skills learned in the classroom. This pathway requires completion of 64 credit hours and a160-hour internship.

Graduates can work in positions in mental health, child care, family services, social services, rehabilitation, correction, and educational agencies. Graduates who continue their education may select from a variety of transfer programs at senior public and private institutions. The median salary for a human services technician in our region is \$37,400.

This program can be completed entirely online, but students must complete a 160-hour internship with an approved agency.



UNIVERSITY TRANSFER





BCCC has several university transfer agreements that guarantee admission to the university.

Pirate Promise with East Carolina University

Guarantees ECU admission for students completing an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree with a 2.5 GPA or greater. Benefits include guaranteed admission, waived ECU transfer application fee, joint academic advising, joint financial aid counseling and RaiseMe microscholarship opportunities, ECU One Card eligibility, access to ECU libraries, and access to Here's How ECU Career Services virtual workshop series.

Pathway to Excellence with University of North Carolina Wilmington

Guarantees UNC-W admission for students completing an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree with a 2.5 GPA or greater. Benefits include guaranteed admission and joint academic advising.

Bachelor of Social Work with UNC-Wilmington

Graduates of this Humans Services Technology pathway can transfer to UNC-Wilmington to complete a Bachelor of Social Work either in person or online. This pathway who plan to continue their education. It requires completion of 66 credit hours and a 160-hour internship.

BSIT-Bachelor of Science in Industrial Technology with East Carolina University

Apply up to 60 hours of NCCCS equivalent coursework into the Bachelor of Science in Industrial Technology (BSIT) Transfer Program at ECU. Students who are admitted into the university are automatically declared into the BSIT if they have or will have a qualifying AAS degree. Guarantees ECU admission for students completing an Associate in Applied Science with a 2.5 GPA or greater. Benefits include joint academic advising, access to ECU libraries, and access to Here's How ECU Career Services virtual workshop series.

WHY START AT BEAUFORT CCC?

Every year, we send students to universities such as East Carolina University, UNC-Wilmington, North Carolina State University, Elizabeth City State University, and UNC-Chapel Hill.

Cost Savings

Many of our students from our service area (Beaufort, Hyde, Tyrrell, and Washington Counties) will qualify for the Beaufort Promise Scholarship in addition to the federal Pell Grant, which is money that they do not need to pay back, so they will **not have to pay anything for tuition and fees**. The Next NC Scholarship can help cover costs for students outside of our service area. We connect students to private scholarships that can help cover the cost of textbooks.

Transfer Success

According to the North Carolina Community College System, students who transferred during 2021-2022 academic year from us fared better than all but six other community colleges in the state. The rankings look at whether students who left the college with 30+ credit hours and went on to a university were still enrolled or graduated from the university a year later. In the case of students who graduated with a full associate degree, 96.3% of them were still at their universities a year later.

College Transfer classes here are also smaller (14:1 student to faculty ratio vs. 17:1 East Carolina University, according to U.S. News), which helps students do better academically by:

- Building stronger relationships with their teachers
- Encouraging students to engage and participate more
- Allowing for more individualized attention
- Providing detailed feedback and guidance

Even in online classes, when individualized attention can seem harder to deliver, the college trains its instructors to teach online and six faculty members have won awards for their online course designs.
